INTRODUCTION

Farming and Farm Families in DeKalb County was an oral history project undertaken by a class in oral history anthropology at Northern Illinois University. Interviewing took place during November and October of 1986. The instructor, seven graduate students in history, and two undergraduates interviewed twenty people engaged in farming in DeKalb County at some period in their lives since World War II. Narrators were drawn chiefly from volunteers who belonged to a retired farmers' association called "Prime Timers." First names are used on the tapes unless narrators chose to be identified by use of the last name as well. Each narrator received a copy of the tape to keep.

Property rights in the collection belong to the Regional History Center. No tapes are restricted in part or in whole.

SERIES DESCRIPTION

Topics discussed in this collection are: changes in farming technology and practices; chores assigned on the basis of age and sex; roles and status of women in farm work; perceptions of farming as a way of life, perceptions of personal independence and economic security; kind and degree of participation in community activities; amount and use of leisure time; and availability of adult education.

The sample of farmers is biased in favor of the successful farmer. The majority of narrators are farmers who retired in some comfort as opposed to those forced out of farming. In fact, there are no representatives of the latter category. There is an age bias as well, with the majority well past retirement age. In spite of the limitations listed above, the collection can be informative. Both large and small farming operations are dis- cussed. The hardships of farming are pointed out, and small farmers talk about the pressures they endured and the reasons they quit farming. Especially interesting is the testimony of both women and men of the changes in relationships with neighbors in the rural areas, in cohesiveness within the family, and in social support networks. Subsequent additions to the collection have focused on the experiences and role of women in farming.

Researchers should note that the first nineteen oral histories are on tape alone, with the exception of OH 3.18, which has been transcribed. Only transcripts are available for oral histories 3.20 through 3.34.

Interview details all aspects of farming life, past and present. Other topics include: Ann as a farm wife and parent, school experiences, and the importance of church, friends and modernization

OH 3.2 DON interviewed by Rosemarie Ostberg

11/3/1986 - Tape

Don's interview details his childhood years growing up on a farm. He explains how he later resurrected a defunct farm

OH 3.3 JOANNE interviewed by Rosemarie Ostberg

11/10/1986 - Tape

Joanne discusses her farming background in LaSalle County as a child during the 1950's and 1960's, as well as her present position as a farm wife employed outside her home.

OH 3.4 KARL BOEKENHAUER interviewed by Greg Vosefski

11/12/1986 - Tape

Boekenhauer farmed in DeKalb County from the 1930's until 1952. After leaving the farm, he continued to be involved in local agriculture.

OH 3.5 LUKE BRIDGER interviewed by Terrence Zeller

10/22/1986 - Tape

Born in South Grove, Illinois in 1910, Bridger lived in the DeKalb area all his life. He began farming in 1931, moved to his present location in 1943, and retired from farming twelve years ago. He eventually farmed over one thousand acres, with livestock forming the basis of his marketing operations. This is the view of a successful farmer and community leader.

Clausen grew up on the farm that he lives on today. This narrative offers a good overview of changes in DeKalb farming. Clausen recalls trends and events in American agriculture.

The interview covers farming and farm life in Malta, Illinois from the 1940's through the 1980's. The Gommel's have lived in their home in Malta since their marriage. They discuss economic and technological changes and the role of the farm bureau.

Jack Kuhn helped his family maintain a dairy farm outside of Warrenville, Illinois. Jack went into plumbing to augment his farm income and spent several years in the service. After his marriage and the sale of the Warrenville property, Jack and his family moved to Clare, Illinois and settled on their present farm.

Other topics include: farming methods in the 1930's and 1940's, implementation of the government farm program, and life on the farm during the depression.
